


The school would like to acknowledge Heller's for sponsoring this year's supply of sausages. Sausages for Schools is about helping more Kiwi kids!

She has extensive experience supporting school wide development and change in the leading, learning and teaching of Mathematics and Statistics in order to improve learning for students.

With an aim to build a shared understanding of the Science of Learning and how it impacts teaching and learning, the staff have spent time exploring the biological and cognitive aspects of the Science of Learning.
